Additionally, please keep an eye on your dog if it is off-leash in your own yard. They can wander off quickly or even rush someone who is simply walking by.

Summer Safety Tips



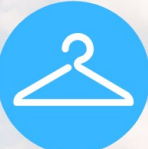
Stay Hydrated

Some medications have side effects such as drowsiness or sun sensitivity



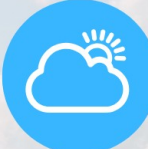
Stay Cool
